



Polio update for April 25, 2025

Note: This update is going out to all District 5130 Presidents, Presidents-Elect, Presidents-Nominees, Club FoundationChairs, PolioPlus Chairs, the District Governor, Area Governors and others who have requested to be on the list. . However, if you wish to no longer receive these updates, please let me know and I'll remove you from the list.

WELL FOLKS, SIX WEEKS WITHOUT A WILD CASE OF POLIO WAS A GOOD RUN, BUT UNFORTUNATELY A NEW CASE POPPED UP IN AFGHANISTAN, OCCURRING ON MARCH 9TH. SO THE 2025 COUNT INCREASES BY ONE, BRINGING THE YEAR TO DATE COUNT TO 8 CASES (2 IN AFGHANISTAN AND 6 IN PAKISTAN). THE 2024 COUNT REMAINS THE SAME AT 99 TOTAL WILD CASES (25 IN AFGHANISTAN AND 74 IN PAKISTAN). THIS WEEK THERE WAS ONLY ONE WILD POSITIVE ENVIRONMENTAL SAMPLE, ALSO FROM AFGHANISTAN.

Rotary's U.S. Polio Eradication Advocacy Task Force in Action

Rotary's Polio Eradication Advocacy Task Force for the United States has been busy meeting with government leaders to advocate for continued U.S. investment for polio eradication efforts. In March, members of the task force visited the capital to speak with leaders from all parties. In early April, task force member and polio survivor John Nanni testified before the House Subcommittee on National Security, Department of State, and Related Program about his experience with polio and Rotary's commitment to it's eradication. Editor's Note: Past Rotary International Vice President Johrita Solari and Chairperson of the US Advocacy Task Force, did share today that the 2024 allocation of \$185 million has been approved, and that the Task Force will be meeting with Congressional leaders again in Mid May to advocate for the same amount for the 2025 budget year. Solari also noted that there are polio champions on both sides of the aisle and they are impressed with the fact that Rotary has donated over \$3 Billion dollars our own money to the cause, and that we are not asking for money for ourselves, but for money for government agencies to spend on polio eradication. It's all about getting money for the kids so we can keep our promise to them of a polio free world. That's what this is all about! Wishing the Task Force good luck in their altruistic endeavor.
